# SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

We reserve the right to accept or reject op-ed articles based upon quality, appropriateness and editorial subjectivity.

## 750 – 1000 words max

This might sound obvious, but you must be knowledgeable about your topic.

Submissions must be exclusive to us and can be of any length, though they are unlikely to be accepted if they are longer than 1000 words. We do not consider articles sent to other publications. Please also note the minimum word limit needs to be 500 words.

We consider only completed articles and do not provide guidance on ideas or proposals.

The tone should be conversational in tone, not academic.

## Image, Byline, Title

Please include a high resolution (300 dpi) image of yourself.

(Include a focused headshot for each author. If possible, avoid those that look like mug shots or bad driver's-license photos!

NOTE: Don't hesitate to ask for examples of images, bios, or headshots. We'll be happy to share examples of what works and looks best!)

Your title, company, position or your byline.

Your article title

Any article sub-title

Any social media handles you want linked.

## Topics

You MUST write about topics that we cover. If you aren't familiar with our topics, read at least three articles from our digital publications. If you submit an article that doesn't match our area of interest, it will be *immediately* rejected.
